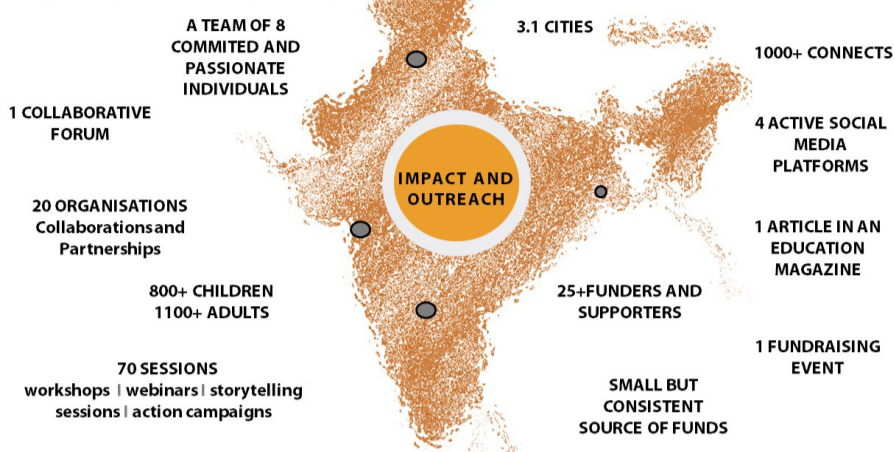

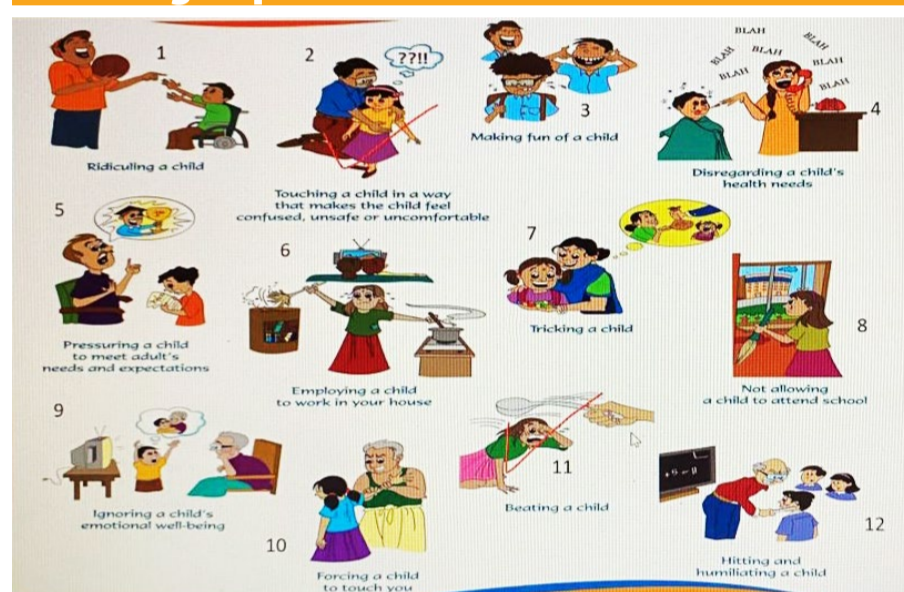

2019 - 2020



Strategies of dealing with issues of child abuse need to be multifaceted—ranging from creating awareness around the issue, building knowledge and capacities of adults, safeguarding children through prevention measures, and to tackle cases of abuse promptly. Over the last two months, the Mudita Foundation team has designed, developed and delivered comprehensive capacity building modules, addressing all these aspects for teachers, community workers, and concerned individuals engaging with children.

Building Capacities



We at Mudita Foundation are proud to share that we have collaborated with Vidya India and National NGO to build the capacities of their teams to move from awareness to action in the context of child sexual abuse.

30+ participants from Delhi, Mumbai, and Bangalore teams of Vidya India, who work closely with children and women in their schools and community centers, engaged with us in weekly sessions to understand the risks and vulnerabilities that exist in their communities. They also strengthened their knowledge of relevant laws, and explored various ways in which educators can keep their learning spaces and larger communities safe from abuse, violence, and exploitation. The module will end in January with each city team making an action plan to creating safe spaces.

3 members of the National NGO (an organisation which works with children in around 6 slum communities in Delhi) team spent over 15 hours understanding abuse, identifying risks and becoming equipped with the knowledge and skill needed to respond to the same. They are now moving into the next phase of assessing the risks in their own communities (through conducting a children's study in collaboration with Mudita Foundation) and developing their own Child Protection Policy with the necessary systems and mechanisms for prevention of and response to child sexual abuse.

We are currently in a collaboration with Mudita Foundation, working on a project related to the POCSO Act. It is an amazing experience with Mudita Foundation because the way they are training us in detail and helping us keenly. I am sure this collaboration is going to continue for a long time.
