ith a resolve to build more In November, a 3 day training was conducted for 38 Child Protection safety champions, we visited Mumbai to execute phase Officers from all the Loreto schools of 2 of 'Leher' with CHIP Mumbai. 26 India. The training focussed on equipping balwadi teachers from Kandivali and the CPOs with the awareness, knowledge Mulund were trained towards creating and skills needed to carry out their safer classrooms by being able to identify, role in the schools towards identifying, respond and prevent abuse. 



They are now beginning to understand critical risks in depth and have started with understanding risks in the online world.
